Our team, consisting of staff and community volunteers, remains actively involved with numerous community organizations, concerned businesses, civic clubs, and individuals, including on-going collaboration with the Bingham Park Environmental Justice Project and the Collaborative Cottage Grove Partnership. Through community meetings and events, we facilitate important discussions, enabling community members to express their concerns and actively participate in advocating for healthy and affordable housing for all.

In April, the Collaborative Cottage Grove Partnership organized a community event in the Willow Oaks neighborhood titled "We Grow Together by Working Together." This impactful Spring Extravaganza attracted over 250 people from East Greensboro for a fun-filled and informative day which connected neighbors and resources.
